Thoughts About Harvest

As I think about this year in ministry, I am excited about all that God has recently accomplished through the ministries of the Church of the Dunes. We have so much to reflect upon, and so much for which to be thankful.

First, our ministry is growing. Worship attendance, both in person and online, has steadily increased. Sometimes I think we could measure this worship growth in decibels and degrees. To sing in our congregation is to find oneself immersed in the loud, beautiful sounds of joyful wonder. The warmth of this congregation and its welcome to all is palpable—warming more all the time. At the church and at locations in the community, the whir of weekday church activity continues. The chair yoga class recently exceeded the 30 mats they had available. One Tuesday recently we had over twenty pickleball players enjoying fellowship and the game. Daily, a Bible study or book discussion group is meeting in some corner of the church or community.

Our mission and social concerns team is humming in harmony with our Dunesman and United Women in Faith. We are helping to build houses, buying chickens and cows to feed the hungry, housing families, feeding our neighbors, fighting for justice, providing counselling through local ministries, and much more. We are now more than tithing (10%+) of our total revenue to local and global missions.

Recently, we kicked-off the new Dunes Concert Series which will add to our community-based, music outreach of free lessons for children, and a community choir which has recently expanded to 30 people. Music? Music is here! All these programs have become feeder groups to our Chancel Choir, Bell Choir, and Celebration Choir.

At the church, new people are everywhere, and they are coming in all ages, shapes, and sizes. People are being drawn to a new or renewed relationship with God in Jesus Christ through our ministry. The harvest is plentiful and so are the willing servants in our congregation. I am so grateful! Let's stop for a moment, celebrate, and then continue working to bless our neighbors as we give God all the glory!

Updates from the Finishing Well Ministry

You are so important to the Church of the Dunes! You are the 55+ age group which constitutes a large part of our membership and friends. The Finishing Well Leadership Team is always open to suggestions of what you would like to learn more about, what you would like to do socially, and what new interests you would like to explore. So, as you can see, this group is all about YOU! Please talk to us; let's get your ideas!

CPR/AED Class in October

The Finishing Well Ministry is planning a presentation on CPR/AED to take place in October. CPR is a procedure to keep the blood pumping when the heart stops until trained medical help arrives, while AED is a machine that can get the heart started again after it stops. This presentation will be an opportunity to learn the basics of CPR using a life-like "Annie" (training mannequin). The importance of AED (Automated External Defibrillator) equipment will also be explained. Church of the Dunes is blessed to have several AED boxes mounted on the walls throughout the church. The American Heart Association has stated that the survival rate of the victims nearly doubles when AED is administered along with CPR. These procedures can save a life and your participation is important. Date and time of this presentation will be coming soon.

Drop in as your schedule permits, or attend weekly to discuss current events and topics from a faith-focused perspective. Each session features a different topic.




Tuesday Morning Bible Study

There is a sign-up sheet on the adult ministries bulletin board located near the church office. The book is \$10 and available from the facilitator.




Fourth Monday Reading Group



Dreamweavers Team Shares Concerts with Community

Dreamweavers was formed in 2022 to explore creative ways to support and grow Church of the Dunes into the future. Authorized by the church's administrative council, and made up of a group of church members, leaders, and the pastor, the team meets regularly to work on its objectives.

One primary objective is to find ways to grow our congregation through better connections with the community. Our belief is that exposing as many people as possible not only to the beautiful objects building but to our friendly sering congregation as well will

With that in mind, and with the help of the church's director of worship arts and the Memorial Music Fund, Church of the Dunes is hosting the Dunes Concert Series, through which we hope to share the gift of music with our congregation and with the community at large.

Current plans for the series include three concerts, and began with "Candid Antics" on September 26. The talented, six-piece,

West-Michigan-based band performed modern jazz with both old-school and new-age influences.

Next up on November 7 at 7:00 p.m. is Ruby John, fiddler, who along with John Warstler on guitar, will play a mix of Métis, Celtic, Bluegrass, standard country, and mountain styles. This music is sure to appeal to a wide audience.

We are also looking to schedule one or two additional concerts this winter and/or early spring. We expect the concert series to be ongoing and already have an additional concert scheduled for May 15, featuring legendary folk singer-songwriter, Joel Mabus.

All concerts are intended to be free of charge although occasional free-will offerings may be taken to support timely needs or specific charities.

Numerous Church of the Dunes members and friends have volunteered to be "Ambassadors" at these concerts, helping guests feel comfortable and welcome.

We look forward to sharing great music with our community as well as our church family. Can you feel it? The Holy Spirit is moving in our church as we begin and share this new ministry!

BLESSING WITH GENEROSITY

Planned Giving and Memorial Fund Approve Scholarships, Make Upgrades

The Memorial Fund continues its support of various church projects. Three Fall Education Grants have recently been approved, which will assist the applicants in their ongoing education. Over the last three years, a total of ten applications from members and affiliates have been approved, all funded by generous donors wishing to help with the cost of further education.

Over the course of 2024 to date, the Memorial Fund has been pleased to support a variety of requests for support, including:

- the banner project creating a more durable and efficient means of hoisting banners in the sanctuary
- the purchase of two media carts one for each level of the church building to improve remote access to on-site meetings, Bible studies, and activities
- additional signage to assist visitors
- additional high-top tables to enhance fellowship time
- support for the purchase of safe bags and locks to improve the security of medication and firearms in homes
- new chairs to help choir members when standing and sitting

Church of the Dunes initiated the Dunes Concert Series this fall, made possible by a generous and ongoing memorial gift honoring a church member. This will enable the church to provide free concerts featuring a variety of music types and artists – a blessing in our beautiful church surroundings.

The committee is continually open to reviewing proposals for funding matches for congregational projects. Please contact me via the church office if you have specific projects in mind.
