PASTOR'S NOTES

Happy New Year!

The new Christian year begins December 1, 2024. We are excited to introduce our worship series: RESTORE. Over the past few years, the losses have mounted. The pandemic, wars and rumors of wars, political mayhem, assassination attempts, acts of terrorism, gun violence in our schools and elsewhere, and the loss of 25% of the United Methodist Church in America. But now, a new year begins.

The arrival of Jesus Christ calls us out of our complacency to the grace-filled work of God. In Jesus Christ, God promised to restore our hope, peace, joy, and love. Through Advent and Christmas, God is inviting each of us to the work of first receiving, and then, restoring hope, peace, joy, and love to a world that hungers for those.

So, this year begins, not with the dropping of a crystal ball, but with a prophet shouting out "Behold the Kingdom of God is at hand." My translation, "The kingdom of God is so close we can touch it." And since that is true, we must join the chorus of those who announce the restoration of God's good creation. In the face of violence and hatred, God is calling us to "restore: hope, peace, joy and love" to our community and to our world.

We are called not to fall back, but instead to allow our historic values to move us forward. Powered by the Holy Spirit, immersed in scriptures, committed in mission to our community and world, we are being called to work for the common good and beloved community. This is a new environment, a kin-dom, that brings hope, provides peace, invites joy, and celebrates love in all its forms.

To move forward this sacred life and call, I will be offering two studies in addition to those Church of the Dunes normally provides:

- I will be leading a 12-week book study using, *The Heart of Christianity: Rediscovering a Life of Faith* by Marcus Borg, one of my most beloved authors and theologians.
- I will also be leading a time of "Bible Reading and Reflection." We will start at the beginning of the Gospel of Luke, simply reading portions of the text together and then taking time to discuss the meaning and application of the gospel to our lives, We will progress as fast or slow as feels comfortable to the group. This will be an ongoing, drop-in class.

Times and dates will be announced for a start date after January 1st. Please be in prayer regarding your desire to be part of one of these studies.

Because of staff retirements and life changes, Church of the Dunes has three current job postings:

Kitchen Coordinator (averages 10 hours per week) Coordinates food-related functions for church events, conferences, meetings, special food service requests, and other events. Oversees the health and safety compliance of the church's kitchen facilities. Requires a county food safety certification or a willingness to become certified. Related experience preferred. Sunday availability needed.

Communications Lead (20 hours per week)

Responsible for curating, scheduling, and producing content for newsletters, announcements, the church website, digital monitors, social media, church-wide emails, and print materials for the church's ministries and activities. Bachelors degree in communications preferred, other relevant experience may be considered.

Finance Manager (10 -12 hours per week)

Oversees fiscal operations, records and maintains utmost confidentiality about individual giving, prepares financial reports, assists in the budget process, assures compliance with related laws, oversees reconciliations, and manages payroll operations. A four-year degree in accounting or finance and experience in church-related or non-profit fiscal management experience is preferred.

by Lifeway Women



Not Alone—Eleven Courageous Widows from the Bible, Part 2


Tuesdays, 10:00 a.m. begins January 7, meets 4 weeks, Room 2 lower level Mary Anne Miller, Facilitator

FOR SAFETY'S SAKE



Many years ago, Church of the Dunes established a winter weather closing practice that still works well today:

On normal school days, when Grand Haven Area Public Schools are closed due to weather conditions, Church of the Dunes is closed, and all activities are cancelled. Closing information is relayed to WoodTV 8, and posted on the church's Facebook page.* On non-school days, our pastor determines if activities are cancelled. If a worship cancellation occurs due to winter weather conditions, church staff will convey the information to Wood TV8 to be included in its list of cancelations and closings.

While Sunday worship cancelations are not common, all are strongly encouraged to choose safety first if weather or road conditions are a concern. Remember, worship services are livestreamed for convenient access on Church of the Dunes YouTube channel.

Frequently asked questions:

Are evening activities held if weather and road conditions have improved?

The winter weather closing policy applies to the entire day. If the church has been closed during the day, staff will not have had the opportunity to clear and salt sidewalks, check the work of the plowing and salting service to assure that parking lot conditions at the church are as safe as possible, or to set up meeting spaces. Because Church of the Dunes is a large and active congregation, it is extremely difficult to communicate schedule information on a case-by-case basis. A one-size-fits-all policy helps all to know what to expect and plan their days accordingly.

My group or committee doesn't mind being out in wintry weather. Can we come to the church to meet anyway?

A winter weather closing applies to the entire church property. Unfortunately, disregarding the policy creates difficulties and liabilities for the church.

If the church building is closed because of winter weather, why are there occasionally staff members on site?

Staff members are strongly encouraged to work from home when the church building is closed because of winter weather. Essential staff are permitted in the building on an as-needed basis to perform functions relating to care of the building, and to prepare for upcoming Sunday worship.

When a winter weather closing happens, please stay safe. Maybe you'd like to cozy up with something warm to drink and a good book, a knitting project, or a movie you've been wanting to watch. Please stay safe, and we'll look forward to seeing one another again when the weather improves.
